The GGS Teaching Datasets are now available!



The GGP Central Hub and Hungarian National Team are proud to present the release of the GGS Teaching Datasets!

The GGS Teaching Datasets, are a **simplified extract of data from GGS-II Wave 1**. This resource offers a unique opportunity to engage with real-world, cross-national survey data, allowing **students and educators** to explore key topics such as family formation, gender attitudes, and well-being. These datasets are **designed to facilitate the teaching and learning of quantitative analysis** in an accessible and practical way.

Two versions of the GGS Teaching Dataset are available. The **Starter Dataset** is perfect for those new to survey data, providing a **smaller set of variables** for introductory statistics and **simpler analyses**. For those looking for more complexity, the **Advanced Dataset** offers **additional variables**, including the

dates of key life events, which can be used for **survival and event history analysis**.

Both datasets can be downloaded from the <u>GGP Colectica platform</u> and are available in SPSS, Stata, and Excel formats. A <u>User Guide</u> is provided to support users, along with two explanatory videos; one <u>introducing the datasets</u> and another offering an <u>in-depth look at the variables</u> included.

GGP-BGR meets for the fourth time







On September 26, 2024, the Generations and Gender Programme Board of Governmental Representatives (GGP-BGR) convened for its **fourth meeting** in The Hague, hosted in a hybrid format. The meeting saw the participation of **35 representatives**, both in-person and online, from **14 countries across the European Union and European Economic Area**.

The meeting focused on strategic discussions regarding the GGP's path towards becoming a European Research Infrastructure Consortium (ERIC).

A significant portion of the meeting was dedicated to discussions on the **GGP-ERIC statutes**, financial documents, and scientific and technical descriptions alongside a presentation on the impact of the GGP in Austria, Croatia, the Netherlands, and the UK.

The meeting wrapped up with a forward-looking perspective, emphasising the **role of GGP in future demographic research** across member states. The GGP will continue to strengthen international cooperation and provide a valuable platform for cross-country collaboration in demographic research.

Guest lecture on longitudinal surveys at the University of Groningen



On September 17th, 2024, **Vytenis Deimantas**, Research Infrastructure Manager at the GGP, gave a **guest lecture** to Master's students at the University of Groningen as part of the course "Demographic Data and Analysis." His lecture, titled "Longitudinal Studies and Panel Surveys: How Do They Help Us Make Sense of the Changing World?", explored the **significance** of longitudinal survey data, comparative data sources in Europe, and the **methodological challenges** faced by these surveys today.

The students also engaged in a practical exercise by **filling in sections of the Generations and Gender Survey (GGS)**, offering their insights on the survey process and its potential to capture changing social patterns. The session provided students with valuable hands-on experience and a deeper understanding of how longitudinal data can inform demographic research.

Updates from the GGP Central Hub



Fieldwork: GGS-II Wave 1 (Baseline questionnaire)

Data collection in Taiwan is still ongoing with over 2,450 conducted CAPI interviews and over 4,900 completed CAWI interviews. **Fieldwork preparations** are also ongoing for many countries such as **Italy**, **Poland**, **South Korea**, **Latvia**, **Iceland** and **Lithuania**.

Fieldwork: GGS-II Wave 2 (Follow-up questionnaire)

Fieldwork preparations are well underway in **Estonia, Czechia** and **Moldova**. All three countries aim to do a pilot before fielding the survey. Fieldwork will commence for Moldova in October and in early 2025 for Estonia and Czechia.
