Call for Abstracts: 8th GGP User Conference!



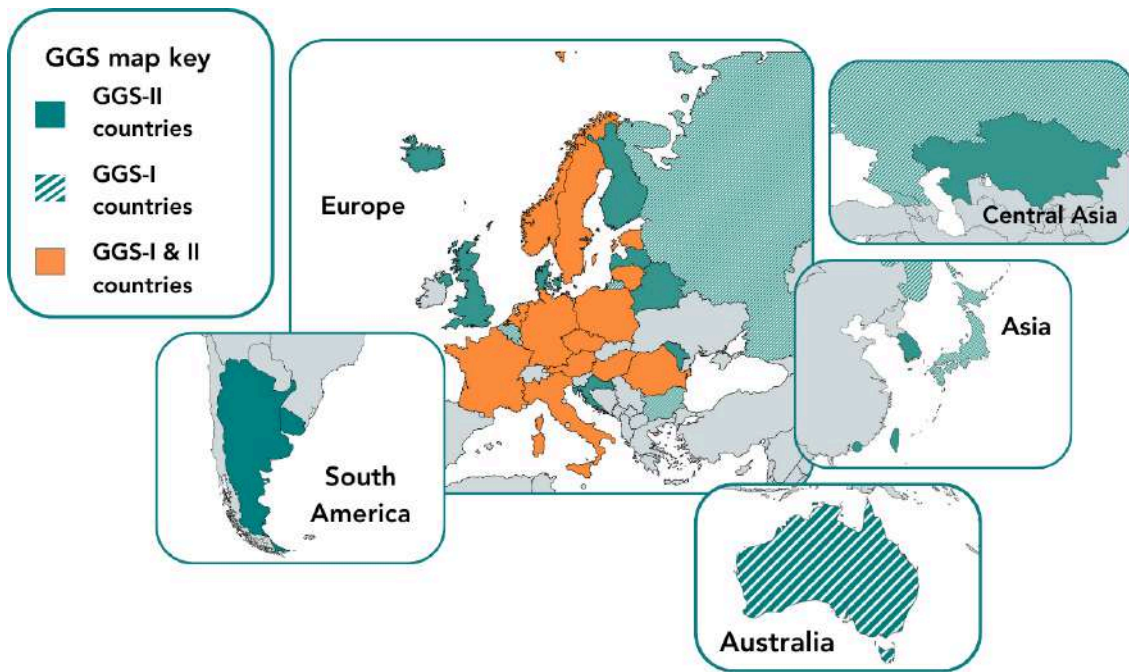
The GGP is delighted to announce the **8th GGP User Conference to be held on 15-17 October 2025 at Tallinn University in Estonia**. We invite researchers working with data from the **Generations and Gender Survey**, the **GGP Contextual Database**, or the **Harmonized Histories** to present and discuss their recent empirical findings and methodological approaches.

The GGP User Conference provides a unique platform for **GGP users, policymakers and the broader research community to exchange ideas and insights**. We especially encourage submissions of papers using data from recently conducted rounds of the GGS, papers providing new methodological insights, and papers using longitudinal or multi-country data.

Abstracts of a maximum 300 words should be submitted by **14th March 2025**. Authors will be notified at the beginning of April about the outcome of their submission.

GGG-II Wave 2 Launch and Expanding Participation



We are excited to announce the release of the **Generations and Gender Survey Round 2 (GGG-II) Wave 2** dataset for Norway—the first country to field Wave 2 in 2024, marking a key milestone for the study. Data collection is also underway in **Czechia, Estonia and Moldova** with their Wave 2 datasets to be released later this year.

To mark the launch, the Norwegian GGP team hosted an **open seminar at Statistics Norway** in December 2024. **Linda Nøstbakken**, Research Director of Statistics Norway, highlighted the GGP’s importance in addressing pressing demographic questions from a comparative perspective. **Lars Dommermuth**, Norway’s GGP project leader, introduced the study’s key themes, while **Prof. Trude Lappegård (University of Oslo)** presented preliminary findings on **fertility intentions (Wave 1) and subsequent births (Wave 2)**. Dommermuth closed by emphasizing the need for continued Norwegian participation and inviting collaboration from national stakeholders and research institutions. The GGS-II is also expanding, with **Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and South Korea** preparing for fieldwork in Wave 1. Their participation broadens the study’s global scope, enhancing its comparative potential and enabling researchers to examine demographic trends across diverse social, cultural, and policy contexts.

GGP at the ODISSEI Conference



The **ODISSEI Conference** was held on the 4th of December 2024 and brought together social scientists to explore innovations in data collection and methodology. Anne Gauthier and Julia Rokos from the GGP presented in a session with **leading experts of major European data infrastructures like SHARE and ESS to discuss the future of social surveys**. A key theme was the transition to **mixed-mode and push-to-web methodologies**, reflecting the growing need for flexible and inclusive survey designs.

Beyond this, sessions on administrative data, survey methodology, and computational advancements underscored the **growing role of digital and interdisciplinary approaches in social science**. The GGP is particularly excited to explore **the potential of incorporating data donation** and other innovations into its research, following the inspiring discussions at the conference.

GGP-Connect Insights and Impact Webinar: Croatia



The most recent **GGP-Connect Insight and Impact webinar** took place on January 30th at 13:00 (CET). **Petra Međimurec (University of Zagreb)** presented on "*GGG Croatia: Experiences in Dissemination and Impact*".

In this webinar, the Croatian national team focused on how they are disseminating the Croatian GGS-II data. The presentation uncovered the **launch of preliminary findings, the media coverage, and the official release of the data**. Furthermore, Petra outlined ongoing activities such as **conferences and plans for the educational use of GGS-II data**, showcasing its impact on advancing knowledge and education.

GGS-II Wave 2 Norway has been released! This is the first Wave 2 country of GGS-II. A minor update has also been released for **GGS-II Wave 1 Norway**, correcting a misclassification in the ISCED education coding. Click [here](#) to access all GGS-II data and more!

Fieldwork: GGS-II Wave 1 (Baseline questionnaire)

Data collection in Taiwan is ongoing, with over 2,900 CAPI interviews and over 4,900 completed CAWI interviews. **Fieldwork preparations** are also ongoing for many countries such as **Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and South Korea**

Data collection in Moldova is ongoing, with over 4,100 interviews completed in CAPI. **Czechia are also in the field**, currently conducting interviews in CAWI mode and **Estonia will begin collecting data in the coming weeks.**
